Lynn has spent more than three decades dedicating her time – as a 4-H parent, volunteer, and Educator – to helping youth thrive in Oneida County. Lynn moved to Rhinelander in 1988 and, while teaching, started a new 4-H club during a time when there was only one active 4-H club in Oneida County. With Lynn's involvement, the club quickly grew to 60 members, forming another club.



In 2013, Lynn was hired as the 4-H/Positive Youth Development Educator with Oneida County Extension. During this time, Lynn doubled 4-H enrollment in Oneida County and helped provide access for many first-generational 4-Hers to attend local, state, national, and international 4-H experiences.
